In Peachland, permits are required before any OPEN BURNING can be done, and these fires are only allowed on a residential property that is 1 hectare (2 1/2 acres) or more. Also, you can NEVER burn compostable materials like leaves, grass or pine needles. Permits are granted after every reasonable alternative to remove wood debris has been pursued. Only cured, dried wood can be burned and only on proper venting days when open burning is allowed. Find out more at www.peachland.ca/open-burning2 or www.rdco.com/outdoorburning.

Please ensure the sidewalk fronting your property is free of snow and ice.


The Central Okanagan is located in prime bear habitat. Bears are typically active from March to December and may be searching for non-natural food sources. While conflict encounters are uncommon, it is important to be alert and follow these tips:

- Put your bins at the curb on the morning of collection only
- Keep your containers in a secure location such as a garage or shed
- Freeze smelly items until garbage pickup day
- Rinse recycling material to eliminate residue and odours
- Wash your carts periodically with a bleach solution
- Collect ripe fruit from trees and off the ground
- Feed pets indoors and keep all food bowls inside
- Clean your BBQ grill after each use
- Avoid using bird feeders during bear season

Preparing for Provincial Zoning Changes



Peachland staff are working to align Peachland's Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw, to meet new provincial regulations, as all BC municipalities will need to do by June 30, 2024.

On Nov. 1, 2023, the Province announced changes as part of the *Homes for People Action Plan* to help create more housing options within BC communities by establishing a more efficient and effective process. Municipalities will be required to amend their zoning bylaws and official community plans to support the Province's vision of more homes for families, seniors, young people and more.



What's ahead for Peachland?

A new year has begun but I'm happy to report that we are already well underway on key projects to support Council's strategic goals. Here are some highlights:





- We are close to partnering with other levels of government to secure much needed childcare spaces in our community.
- We are undertaking asset management in earnest with the development of an Infrastructure & Engineering Department to conduct capacity reviews of our sewer, water and road infrastructure to help plan for the future.
- We'll hold our second annual "Our Peachland" Open House in June don't miss this important engagement event.
- We're collaborating more with the citizens of Peachland with three new committees, the Downtown Revitalization Task Force, the Climate Sustainability and Resiliency Task Force and the Accessibility Advisory Committee. These committees will provide valuable advice to Council in these areas.
- Phase II of the Peachland Seniors' Support Society's affordable housing project on 5th Street will move forward this year with demolition and construction expected to start soon.
- Road rehabilitation, budgeted at \$1.15 million, for the upper Peachland areas will be completed.
- We look forward to supporting the Chamber of Commerce in the development of a new community event on the Sunday of the May long weekend.
