About Peachland

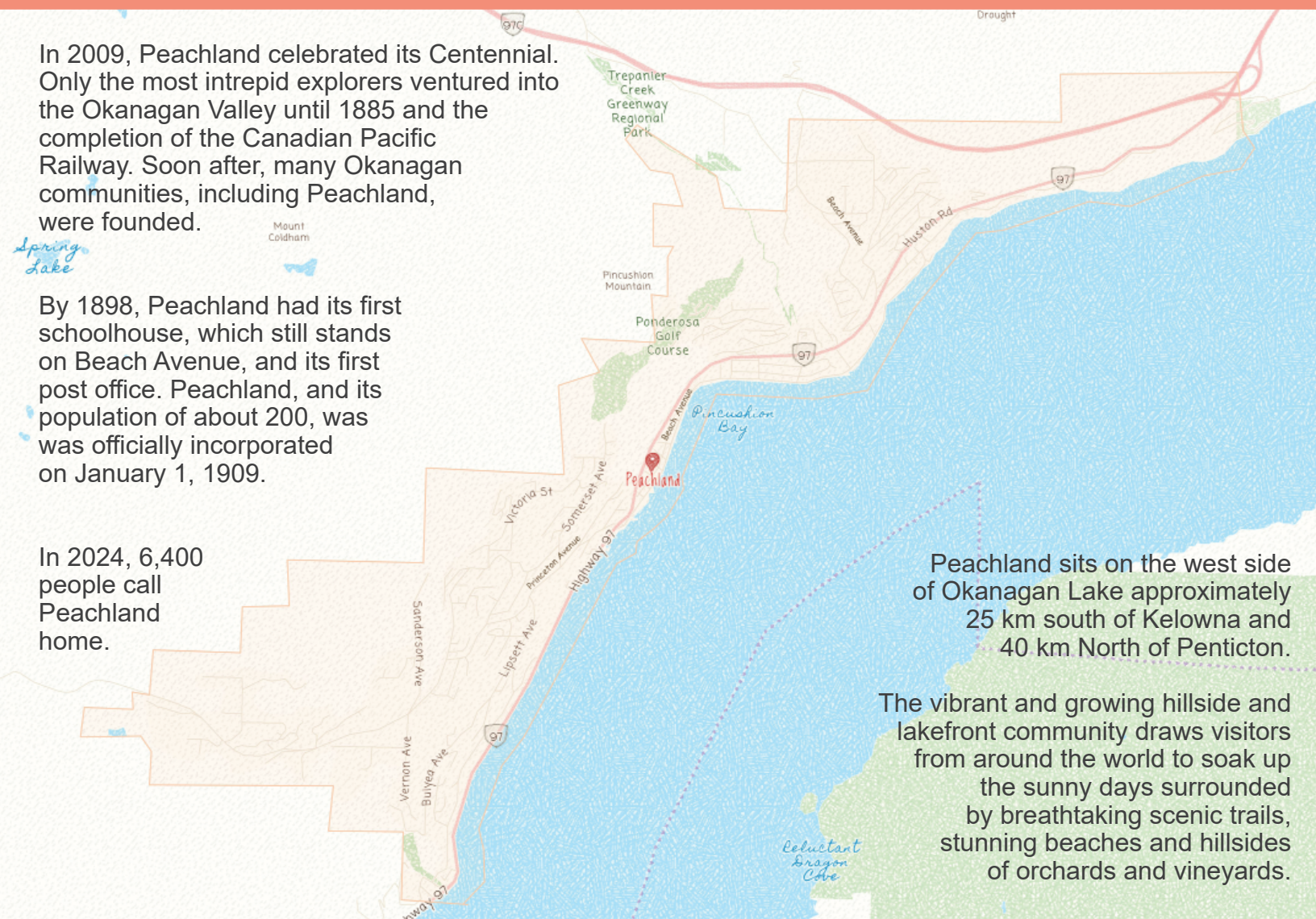
In 2009, Peachland celebrated its Centennial. Only the most intrepid explorers ventured into the Okanagan Valley until 1885 and the completion of the Canadian Pacific Railway. Soon after, many Okanagan communities, including Peachland, were founded.

By 1898, Peachland had its first schoolhouse, which still stands on Beach Avenue, and its first post office. Peachland, and its population of about 200, was officially incorporated on January 1, 1909.

In 2024, 6,400 people call Peachland home.

Peachland sits on the west side of Okanagan Lake approximately 25 km south of Kelowna and 40 km North of Penticton.

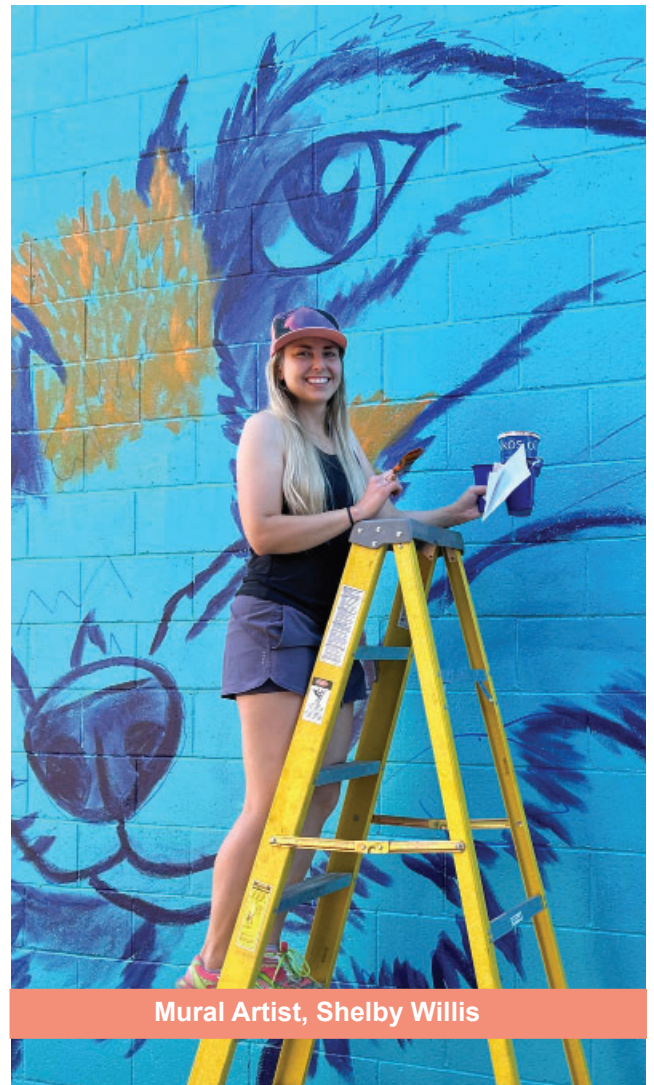

Understanding Your Water Bill

Every property in Peachland receives a water bill every three months detailing the water usage and estimated water bill for the period.

The due date for utilities is 30 days following the date of invoice. Payments made past the due date are subject to a late penalty of 5% on the current quarterly billing.

2024 Rates

Single Family Home:	\$101/quarter base fee plus \$.59 per cubic metre under 400 cubic metres, and \$.74 per cubic metre over 400 cubic metres
Multi-Family Homes:	Based on meter size, starting at \$120 per quarter plus \$.49 per cubic metre
Agricultural:	\$.11 per cubic metre

Water Treatment Plant

Peachland's Water Treatment Plant, located at the Peachland Creek intake site high in the hills off Princeton Avenue, was commissioned in April 2021.

The Peachland Water Treatment Plant provides year-round, safe, clean drinking water for Peachland residents. The plant has a filtration component, eliminating water cloudiness, and disinfects water using both chlorine and ultra-violet (UV), both safe and highly efficient methods.

Water Restrictions

Peachland is always at Stage 1 Water Restrictions meaning homeowners can water their property as follows: even-numbered addresses on even calendar days and odd-numbered addresses on odd calendar days, allowing for watering 3-4 days of the week.

Property Taxes

Understanding Your Property Tax Notice

Every property in Peachland receives a property tax notice in May. Municipal financial plans and tax rates are set by Council typically by April.

Prepayment Plan

The Property Tax Prepayment Program offers a convenient method of paying next year's taxes in advance. Monthly installments are automatically deducted from your bank account on the 15th of every month from July through to the following May. Application forms are available on the District's website at www.peachland.ca/finance.

Property Tax Deferment Program

Tax deferment is a low-interest loan program offered by the Province to help qualified B.C. homeowners pay their annual property taxes. Please visit www.gov.bc.ca/propertytaxdeferment for program information, to apply for tax deferment or to check your application status, or call 1-888-355-2700.

- **Pay in person** by cheque, cash or bank card. Credit Cards are not accepted.

Home Owner Grant

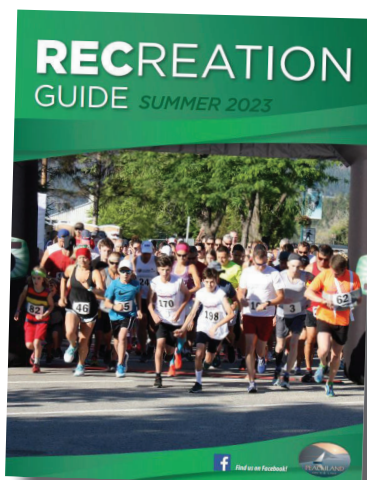

Recreation & Culture

Swim Bay

SWIM BAY (see more information on Page 12) on Beach Ave. across from the Peachland Community Centre is the Okanagan's ONLY lifeguarded public swim area. In the summer months, Peachland Lifeguards supervise 140 metres of waterfront, a high diving board, two floating docks, a zipline and rope swing. They also teach **swimming lessons** at Swim Bay in a fun and natural environment - the only public swim lessons on Okanagan Lake.

Races

- **Canada Day Beach Run** - July 1. Morning run or walk for all ages to begin Canada Day celebrations.
- **Family Glow Run** - Last Friday in September. Participants enjoy a stroll or run along Beach Avenue under the spell of night.
- **Polar Bear Run/Swim** - January 1 (pictured above). Challenge your 2024 resolution to be active. Walk or run 2 or 5 km through scenic Peachland.
- **Rattlesnake Island Swim** - first Saturday in August. Across the lake swim, 3.1 km one-way, or a tough 7 km there and back to Rattlesnake Island.

Heritage Park

Historically the site of a fruit packinghouse, Heritage Park features a day use wharf, Ray Kondola Heritage Fishing Pier, washrooms, picnic area, playground and splash park.



Centennial Walkway

Named in honour of Peachland's 100th, this walkway stretches from Heritage Park (1st St.) to 13th St. along Peachland's waterfront on Okanagan Lake.

Hardy Falls

Pictured above, Hardy Falls is located at the south end of Peachland. This shaded park has a short, flat trail with several bridges over Deep Creek, ending at Hardy Falls. It is a must see in the fall when the Kokanee salmon spawn.



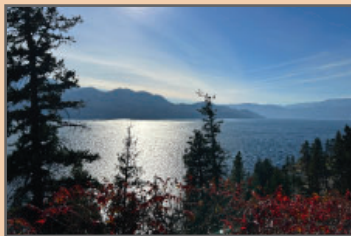
Antlers Beach

Located at the south end of Peachland, this natural beach park on Okanagan Lake includes picnic areas and washrooms. It has fantastic views up and down the lake.



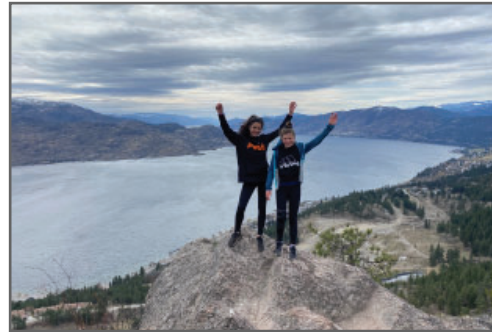
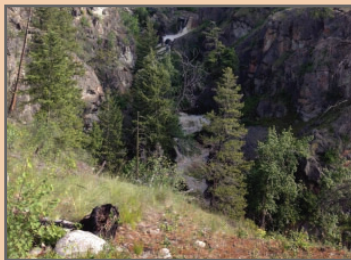
Goat's Peak

Stunning lake and valley views next to rock bluffs and a challenging trail to the lookout at the peak. Located in West Kelowna, it is accessed from Whitworth Road. A new trail connection from Peachland is planned.



Trepanier Creek Greenway

This natural, forested area borders the canyon of Trepanier Creek in Peachland. The trail is a 5 km corridor from Highway 97C to Peachland Elementary School. Remnants of a small dam are still visible.



Pincushion Mountain Park

This challenging climb, which takes about an hour to reach the peak, is worth the view. Sturdy walking shoes and a walking stick are advisable. Some steep parts on this trail.

Boating & Fishing

Boat Launches on Okanagan Lake

Beach Avenue

At 8th Street, in the area known as Strachan Bay, across from the Peachland Community Centre. Parking of vehicles and trailers is allowed only on the LAKE side of Beach Avenue.



Princeton Avenue

Highway 97 & Princeton Avenue, two docks available for launching watercraft. Picnic area swimming area, dogs allowed. Large area for parking vehicles and trailers.



No overnight parking allowed at boat launches or on Beach Avenue.



Day Mooring

Located on Beach Ave. & 1st St., this free day wharf is open to the public. Enter the breakwater with care and follow posted signage. Moor steps away from Peachland downtown businesses.

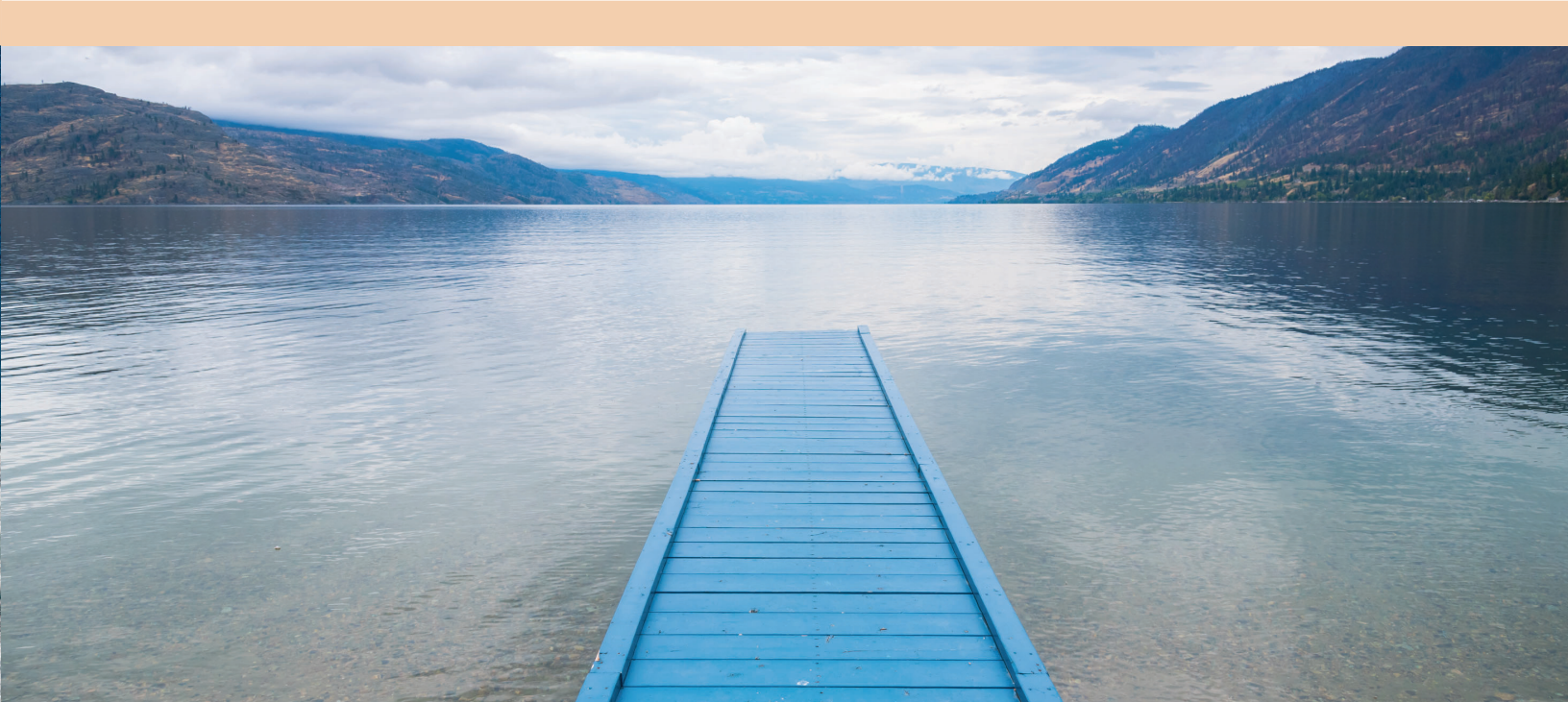

Ray Kandola Heritage Pier

The Peachland Sportsmen's Association, Peachland Lions Club and the Rotary Club of Peachland partnered to build a wheelchair accessible pier in downtown Peachland.

The Ray Kandola Heritage Pier is a 120-metre long pier has breakout areas to allow people to fish while the main pier features wheelchair access with benches to rest and take in the spectacular Okanagan Lake views.



Water Safety



Boating Etiquette

Be Prepared

Know the safety rules for your craft; inform your guests, wear lifejackets, keep safety gear on board.

Watch your wake

Avoid creating obtrusive waves near other boats, swimmers, or the shoreline. Keep the big wakes to the middle of the lake.

Keep it slow

Slow down when using the boat launch or approaching day mooring docks or public swimming areas.

Don't Drive Impaired

It's illegal, number one, and second, it is ALWAYS unsafe. Just don't do it.



A Note About Beach Water Quality

Lake water is not pristine, and beach water quality can fluctuate due to numerous factors including lake currents, runoff and the outflow of creeks, changing environmental factors and waterfowl and animal waste. Swimmer's itch parasites and algae blooms are part of the ecosystem. Be prepared and learn more about local beach water quality at www.interiorhealth.ca.

Garbage, Recycling & Yard Waste

Curbside Collection Schedule

Curbside waste collection occurs weekly for **GARBAGE** (black lid), and every two weeks for **RECYCLING** (blue lid). **YARD WASTE** (green lid) is collected every two weeks from March to December. Place your carts out for collection by 7 am. Do not leave carts out overnight to avoid wildlife conflict.

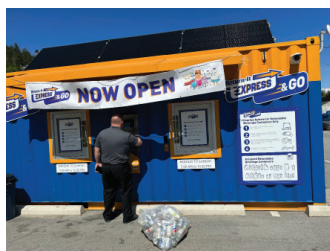

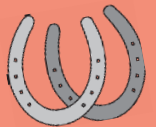

All parking in Peachland is free. No overnight parking on Peachland streets is allowed. A public parking lot is located on 2nd Street in downtown Peachland.

Beach Avenue 30km/hr

Beach Avenue is a popular destination for residents and visitors, particularly in the summer months. With so many pedestrians, cyclists, boaters and motorists on this road, the speed limit is 30km/hr for everyone's protection.



Snow Removal Priorities

Peachland's snow removal priorities are intersections, hills, curves, school zones and bus stops. Major arterial roads are plowed within 12 hours. Secondary collector roads within 36 hours and residential streets within 96 hours.

Help make room for the plow!

Please don't park on the street during heavy snow fall or shovel snow onto the roadway. If you are frustrated by plows depositing snow on your driveway, try shovelling snow to the left (as you face your house).

Spring Sweeping

The annual spring street sweeping begins in March, weather permitting, beginning downtown and moving upwards into Peachland's residential areas.

Business Licensing

Business owners must renew annual business licences by December 31 each year. This includes home-based businesses, short-term rentals and non profits. Non profits are charged a nominal rate of \$1/year for the licence which establishes requirements for fire and life safety.

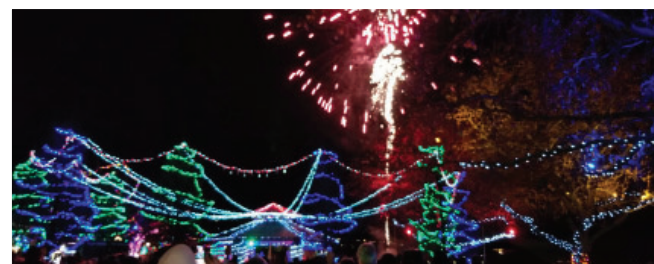

Rattlesnake Island is a small island on Okanagan Lake located directly east of Peachland. The island has a small bay on the south side for refuge of small boats only; very rocky shore, so beach with care. Divers can enjoy small caves on the west side with rock formations and sheer drop-offs.

Squally Point is located at the sharp bend on the eastside of the lake approximately 1 kilometre south of Rattlesnake Island at the approximate mid-point of Okanagan Lake. A small cautionary marker sits on the main point. Stay clear of the rock walls and watch for south winds they can appear suddenly. Good shelter is provided from north winds in the south bay. No beaching for 1/4 mile south or north. Qualified divers only. A cavern entrance that can be explored lies 100 feet from the point and 20 feet down. Take lights and be cautious.

Okanagan Mountain Park is a provincial park focused on the mountain of the same name on the east side of Okanagan Lake, directly across from Peachland. Squally point Marks the south end of the park. Good overnight camping with shelter from north winds. Secluded sandy beaches with picnic tables, fire pits and hiking trails. Places to explore are Commando Bay, and Wild Horse Canyon.
