



## Swimming Pool Water Management Plan

A swimming pool water management plan is a required document for all Swimming Pool Building Permit Applications. The plan must include the information outlined below.

- **Site Plan:** A sketch or drawing must accompany the BP application and include the location of the proposed swimming pool. Show distances to any retaining walls, property lines and structures.
- **Drainage Plan:** In the event the pool needs to be drained, whether fully or partially, at any time or for any reason, please indicate the following:

◇ How will the water be dechlorinated or desalinated?

◇ Where will the water be drained to or disposed of?

⇒ Infiltrate into soil on property: **Y / N** \*See notes below for restrictions.

⇒ Hauled away and disposed of offsite: **Y / N** If yes, indicate intended authorized disposal site:

\* **Note:** Under no circumstances shall pool water be drained onto District property or into District storm or sanitary systems or across property lines onto adjacent private properties. Pool water is to remain on the same property which the pool is located or be disposed of off site at an authorized legal disposal site. Reference 'Sewer Regulation Bylaw No. 1486, Section 2—Waste Discharge' and 'Traffic Regulation Bylaw No. 1856, Division Fourteen—Interference with Traffic and Signs'.

\* **Note:** Pool water drained onto the same property which the pool is located shall be released at such a rate as to ensure it infiltrates fully into the soil, does not cause ponding, and does not cause flooding or erosion on adjacent properties.

\* **Note:** Pool water shall not be drained adjacent to any retaining wall. At the owner's expense, a geotechnical engineer shall determine the appropriate distance from the retaining wall that drainage is permitted.
